Frequently Asked Questions

What is a hybrid course?

A hybrid course blends traditional in-class teaching and online learning. Depending on the subject, the amount of Web-based instruction ranges from 30-70 percent, with the remainder taking place in a traditional classroom setting.

What technology will I need?

A reliable Internet connection is necessary. If you do not have your own computer, you can use campus computers.

What software is used?

Most hybrid courses use a program called Blackboard. You can log on to get your Blackboard account at <http://tac.nvcc.edu/blackboard/>

How much time will a hybrid course take?

Hybrid courses are not condensed courses. The online portion of a hybrid course requires the same number of contact hours as the face-to-face class time that it is replacing.

How can I succeed in a hybrid course?

- You should be comfortable using computers and the Internet
- You need excellent time management skills and self-motivation
- You need to keep up with class reading
- You need to stay current with the class calendar
- You need to read assignments and follow directions carefully

What if I want to take a hybrid course but I can't come to campus?
