OCT 295 – TRENDS IN PROFESSIONAL ISSUES IN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY PRACTICE (1 CR.)

Course Description

Provides an opportunity to explore topical areas needed by students. Topics of discussion will be professional issues and trends, including: NBCOT board examinations, obtaining licensure, maintaining professional organization membership, becoming a fieldwork educator and other topics related to lifelong learning opportunities. 0

General Course Purpose

The purpose of this course is to prepare students toward transitioning into new roles as occupational therapy assistant professionals and life-long learners. This course will prepare students on topics such as: national credentialing and varying state professional requirements, participating in advocacy efforts and professional organizations, participating in fieldwork education, understanding the impact of various contextual trends on the profession, and self-identifying competencies as preparatory for transition into a career as an occupational therapy assistant.

Course Prerequisites/Corequisites

Prerequisite: Completion of OTA program semesters 1-4 coursework.

Course Objectives

Upon completing the course, the student will be able to:

- Identify the impact of current contextual factors, (i.e. sociopolitical, technological) on the management and delivery of occupational therapy services. ***(aligns with 2018 ACOTE standard B.5.1)***
- Understand the impact of current policies and the socioeconomic, political, geographic, and/or demographic factors that influence current practice trends for persons, groups, populations and social systems as related to occupational therapy practice. ***(aligns with 2018 ACOTE standard B.5.1)***
- Demonstrate knowledge of applicable national requirements for credentialing and requirements for licensure, certification, or registration under federal and state laws. ***(aligns with 2018 ACOTE standard B.5.5)***
- Articulate the importance of and the benefits of life-long learning and develop practical strategies to ensure participation in professional development activities within occupational therapy that is consistent with current and accepted standards.
- Describe the criteria needed to be a fieldwork educator and describe the importance of the ongoing professional responsibility to provide fieldwork education.
- Professionally advocate the importance of active participation in international, American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA) and state OT associations and the importance of supporting AOTPAC as well as American Occupational Therapy Foundation (AOTF). ***(aligns with 2018 ACOTE standard B.7.2)***
- Identify personal and professional abilities and competencies through self-reflection and critical analysis as related to job responsibilities as an OTA.
- Explain and provide examples of how the role of an OTA is enhanced by knowledge of and involvement in AOTA, OT state associations, international associations, and local OT associations. ***(aligns with 2018 ACOTE standard B.7.2)***

Major Topics to be Included

- Importance of life-long learning and professional advocacy.
- Preparation for national requirements for credentialing and state requirements for licensure, certification or registration under state laws.
- Recognize the importance of involvement in international national, and state professional organizations.
- Reflection on self-abilities and competencies as related to one's career as an OTA.
- Understand the influence of the ever-changing contexts that impact practice trends.
- Understand the criteria needed and the professional responsibility of becoming a fieldwork educator.
