ADVANCE Program Milestones

1. Students must take SDV 100 or SDV 101 in the first semester at NOVA.
2. Students must begin Developmental coursework in the first semester in ADVANCE at NOVA.
3. Students must take first college-level MTH course and ENG 111 in the semester immediately following the completion of any MTE or ENF courses (excluding summer).
4. In the first 30 credits, students must:
 - a. Complete ENG 111 and ENG 112 with a C or better.
 - b. Complete the first college-level MTH course with a C or better.
5. Students must complete at least six degree-applicable credits with a C or better each fall and spring semester.
6. Students must maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA.
7. Students must apply for NOVA graduation and complete their Associate's degree.
8. Students must complete the Social Work application and successfully matriculate into the program prior to beginning senior field practicum.

Social Work Program Requirements:

1. Students must complete 45 credit hours with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.
2. Students must either complete or be registered for BIO 101 (BIOL 103), ENG 111 (ENGH 101), SOC 200 (SOCI 101), PSY 200 (PSYC 100).
3. Students must earn a C or better in SOCW 200, 357, 361 and at least two of the following courses: SOCW 311, 312, 375, 380.
4. Students must be enrolled in all other required 300-level SOCW courses.
5. Students must submit their application by the posted deadline (See: Advisor).
6. Students must complete the following courses (including prerequisites) before beginning the fall semester when you begin the senior field practicum: SOCW 200, 311, 312, 357, 361, 358, 362, 375, and 380.
7. Students must maintain a 2.5 GPA once admitted to the major.
