## Additional General Notes \& Resources:

- Students pursuing this degree must complete 33 credits in English/Linguistics/Folklore beyond ENGH 300 (not including ENGH 302) with a minimum GPA
of 2.00. At least 9 credits (including the capstone requirement) must be at the 400 level.
- Students interested in pursuing licensure to teach at the secondary level may add the Undergraduate Certificate: Secondary Education - English to this

Some certificate courses can be used to fulfill general elective requirements, but additional credits may be needed to complete the certificate. - Students who complete a VCCS transfer associate degree (AS, AA, \& AFA) will receive a waiver of the Foundation and Exploration (lower division) Mason Core general education categories. To be eligible for the waiver, the students must provide the Mason Office of Admissions with a final, official transcript reflecting the degree conferral date. As a prerequisite for ENGH 302, ENGH 101 is not waived. Students must complete ENGH 100 or ENGH 101, or an equivalent, with a C or higher.
