## **ADVANCE Program Milestones**

ADVANCE Milestone Requirements: All ADVANCE students must adhere to the following requirements. For Milestones #1-#3, failure to meet these milestones will prevent a student from matriculating to Mason and/or result in termination from ADVANCE. For Milestones #4-#7, failure to meet these milestones may delay matriculation to Mason.

- 1. Students must complete their NOVA degree within 4 years of being admitted into ADVANCE. Students are <u>highly encouraged</u> to be continuously enrolled at NOVA/Mason to support progress towards degree completion.
- 2. Students must maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA at NOVA and must have a minimum 2.5 GPA upon matriculation to Mason.
- 3. Students who wish to enroll at Mason for the fall semester must apply for NOVA spring graduation by March 1 or summer graduation by June 1. Students who wish to enroll at Mason for the spring semester must apply for NOVA fall graduation by October 1.
- 4. Students must begin developmental coursework no later than the first semester in ADVANCE at NOVA.
- 5. Students must take first college-level MTH course and ENG 111 in the semester immediately following the completion of any MDE or EDE courses (excluding summer).
- 6. In the first 30 credits, students must complete ENG 111 and ENG 112 with a C or better.
- 7. Students must complete a Mason Core Quantitative Reasoning course equivalent with a C or better no later than one semester before NOVA graduation. Refer to your pathway to select the appropriate MTH course(s).

The classic "Bachelor of Arts in History - No Concentration" is preferred by many History majors for its flexibility. However, it is possible to pursue a concentration within the major: Digital History, Public History, Global History, U.S. History, or an Individualized Concentration. The A.A. Liberals Arts Pathway for History will put you in the position to pursue any one of these concentrations. Please consult your ADVANCE Coach or Mason Advisor for guidance on the concentration that fits your interests and goals.

#### Additional General Notes & Resources:

- Students pursuing this degree must complete 36 credits within the major with at least 18 credits at the 300 and 400 levels. Additional credits of history in excess of 36 may be presented as elective credits to be counted toward graduation. Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.00 in courses applied to the major. HIST 300 Introduction to Historical Method (Mason Core) and HIST 499 RS: Senior Seminar in History (Mason Core) may not be used to satisfy the geographic distribution requirements in U.S. history, European history, and global, Latin American, African, Asian, or Middle Eastern history. No more than 3 credits of ARTH coursework may apply to the History BA.
- Students interested in pursuing licensure to teach at the secondary level may add the Undergraduate Certificate: Secondary Education History to this degree. For more information visit: https://education.gmu.edu/secondary-education-6-12/academics/. Some certificate courses can be used to fulfill general elective requirements, but additional credits may be needed to complete the certificate. Students interested in teacher licensure should meet with a Mason pre-teacher advisor. Contact information: https://cehd.gmu.edu/teacher/advising/advising-appointment/. Students interested in exploring a teaching career may take EDU 200 as an Open Elective at NOVA. Students taking EDU 200 should meet with their Mason advisor to ensure they are fulfilling their Mason Core Global Understanding requirement through major coursework or a general elective.
- Students who complete a VCCS transfer associate degree (AS, AA, & AFA) will receive a waiver of the Foundation and Exploration (lower division) Mason Core general education categories. To be eligible for the waiver, the students must provide the Mason Office of Admissions with a final, official transcript reflecting the degree conferral date. As a prerequisite for ENGH 302, ENGH 101 is not waived. Students must complete ENGH 100 or ENGH 101, or an equivalent, with a C or higher.
