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This report provides the unduplicated headcount of dual enrollment students at Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA). The report presents data for contract, on-campus, and online dual enrollment students.¹ Four years of data are presented.

Table 1 presents the number of dual enrollment (DE) students by discipline and instructional mode for the Fall 2016 through Fall 2019 semesters. In the table, "Contract" refers to contract dual enrollment students, "On-Campus" refers to on-campus dual enrollment students (i.e., dual enrollment students taking classes on a NOVA campus), and "Online" refers to NOVA Online (NOL) dual enrollment students. Students are unduplicated by mode; if students enrolled online and on-campus, they are counted under both. For example, a student taking two on-campus Accounting (ACC) courses is counted once, but a student taking two online and two on-campus ACC courses is counted once under each.

For example, a student taking two oncampus Accounting (ACC) courses is counted once, but a student taking two online and two oncampus ACC courses is counted once under each.
