# Loss/Momentum Framework at NOVA: Progress-Related Data for Student Sub-Groups

This Research Brief provides information on the Progress-related portion of the Loss/Momentum Framework as it pertains to retention and progress (credit completion) at NOVA. There are two sections: Retention and Progress. The first section includes data and analysis on fall-to-spring retention and fall-to-fall retention of First-Time in College<sup>1</sup> (FTIC) students. The second section includes data and analysis on the progress of FTIC students completing 12 credits and 24 credits.

### I. Progress-Related Data: Retention

### **A. Executive Summary**

### **Fall-to-Spring Retention**

#### Fall-to-Spring Retention by Initial Enrollment Status

• Fall-to-Spring retention rates of full-time students were often over 20 percentage points higher than those of part-time students.

### Fall-to-Spring Retention by Gender (Table 1)

- Fall-to-Spring retention rates by gender were higher among female students than male students.
- Fall-to-Spring retention rates ranged 88 to 90 percent for female students **enrolled full-time** and between 86 to 88 percent for male students **enrolled full-time**.
- Fall-to-Spring retention rates were between 65 to 67 percent for female students enrolled part-time and 59 to 61 percent for male students **enrolled part-time**.

#### Fall-to-Spring Retention by Age (Table 2)

 The 24 and younger age group Fall-to-Spring retention rates ranged 88 to 89 percent for full-time students and 65 to 67 percent for part-time students.

### Fall-to-Spring Retention by Race/Ethnicity (Table 3)

- Among the largest racial/ethnic groups, Fall-to-Spring retention rates were highest among **Asian students** and lowest among **Black students**.
- The Fall-to-Spring retention rates for **Asian students attending full-time** were between 92 to 93 percent and 86 to 88 percent for **Black students attending full-time**.
- The Fall-to-Spring retention rates were 69 to 71 percent for **Asian students attending** part-time and 54 to 57 percent for **Black students attending part-time**.

### Fall-to-Spring Retention by Initial Program Placement (Table 4)

- Fall-to-Spring retention rates tended to be highest for students placed in **A.S. programs** and lowest for **non-program placed** students.
- Fall-to-Spring retention rates for **full-time students in A.S. programs** were around 89 to 90 percent and 66 to 69 percent for **part-time students in A.S. programs**.

#### **Fall-to-Fall Retention**

### Fall-to-Fall Retention by Initial Enrollment Status (Table 5)

• Fall-to-Fall retention rates of full-time students were often over 20 percentage points higher than those of part-time students.

# Fall-to-Fall Retention by Gender (Table 5)

- The Fall-to-Fall retention of **female students enrolled full-time** ranged from 70 to 72 percent, compared to 65 to 69 percent for **male students enrolled full-time**.
- The Fall-to-Fall retention of **female students enrolled part-time** ranged from 46 to 50 percent, compared to 41 to 43 percent for **male students enrolled part-time**.

#### Fall-to-Fall Retention by Age (Table 6)

• The Fall-to-Fall retention rates for **full-time students 24 and younger** were between 69 and 72 percent and between 47 and 50 percent for **part-time students 24 or younger**.

# Fall-to-Fall Retention by Race/Ethnicity (Table 7)

- Of the largest ethnic groups at NOVA, Asian students enrolled full-time attained the highest Fall-to-Fall retention rates (80 to 82 percent) and Black students enrolled fulltime attained the lowest rates (59 to 62 percent).
- For students enrolled part-time, Asian students' Fall-to-Fall retention rates were between 53 and 55 percent while Black students' rates were between 34 and 36 percent.

### Fall-to-Fall Retention by Initial Program Placement (Table 8)

- Students enrolled in the **A.S. program** represented the majority of the population and these students generally attained had the highest Fall-to-Fall retention rates: 70 to 73 percent for those enrolled full-time and 48 to 53 for those enrolled part-time.
- Students enrolled in **transfer degree programs** had higher Fall-to-Fall retention rates than students enrolled in **technical degree programs**.

# **B. Fall-to-Spring Retention**

# II. Progress-Related Data: Progress Completing Credits

# **A. Executive Summary**

**Progress 12:** The number and percentage of fall cohort students who completed 12 college credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher by the end of the spring of the same academic year.

### Progress 12 by Gender (Table 9)

The Progress 12 rates of female students attending full-time ranged from 65 to 69 percent, compared 60 percent for male students attending NOVA full-time.

### Progress 12 by Age (Table 10)

• Full-time students ages 24 and younger were between 63 to 65 percent, compared for 35 to 38 percent for part-time students ages 24 and younger.

### Progress 12 by Race/Ethnicity (Table 11)

- Asian students enrolled full-time tended to have the highest Progress 12 rates (70 to 74 percent), followed by White students enrolled full-time (65 to 68 percent).
- **Black students attending full-time** tended to have the lowest Progress 12 rates among full-time students (53 to 55 percent).

# Progress 12 by Program Placement (Table 12)

• **Full-time students in the A.S. program** tended to have the highest Progress 12 rates (64 to 65 percent), followed by full-time students in the **A.A. program** (62 to 68 percent).

**Progress 24:** The number and percentage of fall cohort students who completed 24 college credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher by the end of the spring of the next academic year.

# Progress 24 by Gender (Table 13)

• The Progress 24 rates of students attending NOVA full-time was between 54 and 59 percent for **female students** and 50 to 51 percent for **male students**.

#### Progress 24 by Age (Table 14)

Full-time students ages 24 or younger attained Progress 24 rates between 53 and 55 percent.

### Progress 24 by Race/Ethnicity (Table 15)

Asian students attending full-time had the highest Progress 24 rates (64 to 66 percent), while Black students had the lowest rates (38 to 44 percent).

# Progress 24 by Program Placement (Table 16)

• Full-time students in the **A.A. and A.S. programs** tended to have similar Progress 24 rates (54 to 57 percent); while students in other programs had markedly lower Progress 24 rates.
