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Point-in-Time Comparisons of Enrollment by Campus, Division, ELI, Session, and Recent High School Graduates: Fall 2015 Versus Fall 2014 – July 20, 2015

Executive Summary

The comparisons in this document are between corresponding points in time in Fall registration at NOVA. Registration is presented from Monday, 7/21/2014 for Fall 2014 and from Monday, 7/20/2015 for Fall 2015.

Section 1. FTES by Campus and Division

- There was a 6 percent <u>decrease</u> in overall College-wide FTES enrollment. (Table 1)
 - AL Campus (-502 FTES; -15%)
 - AN Campus (-431 FTES; -7%)
- The following campus divisions <u>decreased</u> the greatest in FTES¹. (Table 2)
 - AN: Business & Public Services (-110 FTES; -10%), Liberal Arts (-136 FTES; -10%), and Math, Science, & Engineering (-135 FTES; -7%)
 - LO: Communication & Human Studies (-99 FTES; -7%)
 - MA: Communication Technologies & Social Sciences (-67 FTES; -5%)
 - WO: Arts, Communication, & Humanities (-81 FTES; -10%)

Section 2. <u>ELI FTES</u> by Campus and Division

- ELI FTES <u>decreased</u> at each of the six campuses and <u>decreased</u> overall by 6 percent. (Table 3)
 - AN ELI (-60 FTES; -8%)
 - LO ELI (-43 FTES; -13%)
- The following campus divisions <u>decreased</u> the greatest in ELI FTES¹: (Table 4)
 - AN ELI: Liberal Arts (-24 FTES; -12%) and Math, Science, & Engineering (-29 FTES; -12%)
 - LO ELI: Communication & Human Studies (-39 FTES; -18%)

Section 3. FTES by Session and Campus

- FTES Enrollment <u>decreased</u> the greatest in the following sessions: **(Table 5)**
 - AL: 16-Week Session (-538 FTES; -21%)
 - AN: 16-Week Session (-502 FTES; -12%)
 - MA: 16-Week Session (-124 FTES; -6%)
 - WO: 16-Week Session (-150 FTES; -7%)

¹In Fall 2015 at the AL Campus, selected disciplines from the Liberal Arts and Science, Tech., & Business divisions were distributed into a new division: Professional Services & Social Sciences. Therefore, AL Campus division FTES cannot be compared from Fall 2014 to Fall 2015.

Section 4. Headcount of Recent Northern Virginia Public High School Graduates A. Applied

- Applications by recent Northern Virginia public high school graduates <u>increased</u> by under 1 percent. **(Table 6)**
- The greatest <u>decreases</u> in applications by recent Northern Virginia public high school graduates were as follows: **(Table 6)**
 - Annandale Campus service area (-93 applicants; -6%)
 - Annandale High (-42), Falls Church High (-45), Lake Braddock Secondary (-16), McLean High (-17)
 - Loudoun Campus service area (-93 applicants; -7%)
 - Broad Run High (-27), Freedom High (-21), Loudoun Co. High (-23), Loudoun Valley High (-21), Stone Bridge High (-22)
 - Other individual high schools:
 - Bryant Alternative High (-17), C.D. Hylton (-44), Stuart High (-21)

B. Registered

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- Registrations by recent Northern Virginia public high school graduates <u>decreased</u> by 5 percent overall. **(Table 6)**
 - Pathway students: registrations <u>decreased</u> 2 percent (Table 7)
 - Loudoun service area (-49 students; -10%)
 - Non-Pathway students: registrations <u>decreased</u> 8 percent (Table 7)
 - Alexandria service area (-54 students; -34%)
 - Loudoun service area (-76 students; -32%)
 - Woodbridge service area (-19 students; -5%)
- The greatest <u>decreases</u> in registrations by recent Northern Virginia public high school graduates were as follows: **(Table 6)**
 - Alexandria Campus service area (-42 students; -10%)
 - Stuart High (-31 students)
 - Loudoun Campus service area (-125 students; -17%)
 - Broad Run High (-27), Loudoun Co. High (-24), Park View High (-17), Stone Bridge High (-17)
 - Other individual high schools:
 - Annandale High (-34), Falls Church High (-27), Osbourn Park High (-21), Stonewall Jackson High (-20), C.D. Hylton High (-30), Potomac Senior High (-20)
- The percentage of applicants who registered <u>decreased</u> from 46 percent to 44 percent. **(Table 8)**
 - o Pathway students: remained at 22 percent of applicants
 - Non-Pathway students: <u>decreased</u> from 24 percent to 22 percent of applicants
