

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Introduction

To help understand changes in student enrollment between Fall 2012 and Fall 2014, this Report compares headcount and average credits taken among various demographic sub-groups of NOVA students. Changes in headcount and the average number of credits in which students enroll can affect the amount of Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES), an important indicator of college performance. In the tables presented, data are provided for the course campus and disaggregated by student demographic characteristics. A summary of findings is provided at the college-wide level and for each campus. Major findings include the following:

- At the college-wide level, headcount decreased by 1 percent (-377 students) and average credit enrollment decreased by 1 percent (-0.11 credits).
- Headcount decreased at three campuses:
 - o Alexandria Campus (-974 students; -7 percent)
 - Annandale Campus (-448 students; -2 percent)
 - Medical Education Campus (-38 students, -2 percent)
- Headcount increased at two campuses:
 - Loudoun Campus (+1,459 students; +15 percent)
 - Manassas Campus (+999 students; +14 percent)
- Average credit enrollment decreased at all campuses:
 - Alexandria Campus (-0.36 credits; -5 percent)
 - Annandale Campus (-0.20 credits; -3 percent)
 - Loudoun Campus (-0.36 credits; -5 percent)
 - Manassas Campus (-0.17 credits; -3 percent)
 - Medical Education Campus (-0.19 credits; -4 percent)
 - Woodbridge Campus (-0.06 credits; -1 percent)

Headcount and Average Credits by Student Demographics College-Wide: Fall 2012 through Fall 2014

Headcount

At NOVA, headcount decreased by 1 percent (-377 students) from 51,864 students in Fall 2012 to 51,487 students in Fall 2014. Disaggregating the data by demographic categories reveals the following considerable changes in headcount between Fall 2012 and Fall 2014.

Age Group

- o Under 18: increased from 1,228 students to 2,231 students (+1,003 students; +82 percent)
- o 18-21: increased from 20,789 students to 21,659 students (+870 students; +4 percent)
- o 22-24: decreased from 8,919 students to 8,333 students (-586 students; -7 percent)
- 25-29: decreased from 7,854 students to 7,409 students (-445 students; -6 percent)
- o 30-44: decreased from 9,148 students to 8,361 students (-787 students; -9 percent)
- 45-59: decreased from 3,148 students to 2,697 students (-451 students; -14 percent)

Student Type

- o First-time in college: increased from 8,888 students to 10,534 students (+1,646 students; +19 percent)
- o Returning/Reapplying: decreased from 38,428 students to 37,287 students (-1,141 students; -3 percent)
- o Transfer: decreased from 4,548 students to 3,666 students (-882 students; -19 percent)

Race/Ethnicity

- White: decreased from 21,686 students to 20,358 students (-1,328 students; -6 percent)
- Hispanic/Latino: increased from 9,438 students to 10,665 students (+1,227 students; +13 percent)

- Fairfax County: decreased from 18,798 students to 17,566 students (-1,232 students; -7 percent)
- Loudoun County: increased from 5,596 students to 6,801 students (+1,205 students; +22 percent)

Overall, the average number of credits enrolled in per semester by students decreased by 1 percent from 8.93 credits in Fall 2012 to 8.82 credits in Fall 2014. Disaggregating the data by demographic categories reveals the following sizable changes between Fall 2012 and Fall 2014 in average credit enrollment.

Age Group

o Under 18: the average decreased from 5.38 credits to 4.36 credits (-1.02 credits; -19 percent)

Student Type

o First-time in college: the average decreased from 10.24 credits to 9.47 credits (-0.77 credits; -8 percent)

Race/Ethnicity

o Two or more races: the average decreased from 9.75 credits to 9.33 credits (-0.42 credits; -4 percent)

- o Loudoun County: the average decreased from 9.19 credits to 8.45 credits (-0.74 credits; -8 percent)
- o Manassas City: the average decreased from 9.81 credits to 9.39 credits (-0.42 credits; -4 percent)

Headcount and Average Credits by Student Demographics at the Alexandria Campus: Fall 2012 through Fall 2014

Headcount

The headcount at Alexandria Campus decreased by 7 percent (-974 students) from 15,071 students in Fall 2012 to 14,097 students in Fall 2014. Disaggregating the data by demographic categories reveals the following most substantial changes in headcount at the campus between Fall 2012 and Fall 2014.

Age Group

- Under 18: increased from 249 students to 423 students (+174 students; +70 percent)
- o 22-24: decreased from 2,724 students to 2,498 students (-226 students; -8 percent)
- o 25-29: decreased from 2,859 students to 2,545 students (-314 students, -11 percent)
- o 30-44: decreased from 3,263 students to 2,896 students (-367 students, -11 percent)

Gender

- o Male: decreased from 6,996 students to 6,553 students (-443 students; -6 percent)
- Female: decreased from 8,075 students to 7,544 students (-531 students; -7 percent)

Student Type

- o Returning/Reapplying: decreased from 11,705 students to 10,961 students (-744 students;-6 percent)
- o Transfer: decreased from 1,448 students to 1,149 students (-299 students; -21 percent)

Race/Ethnicity

White: decreased from 5,472 students to 4,690 students (-782 students; -14 percent)

Jurisdiction

o Fairfax County: decreased from 4,652 students to 4,052 students (-600 students; -13 percent)

The average number of credits students enrolled in per semester at Alexandria Campus decreased by 5 percent from 6.64 credits in Fall 2012 to 6.28 credits in Fall 2014. Disaggregating the data by demographic categories reveals the following marked changes in average credit enrollment between Fall 2012 and Fall 2014.

Age Group

- o 18-21: the average decreased from 8.15 credits to 7.72 credits (-0.43 credits; -5 percent)
- o 22-24: the average decreased from 6.80 credits to 6.14 credits (-0.66 credits; -10 percent)
- o 25-29: the average decreased from 6.27 credits to 5.92 credits (-0.35 credits; -6 percent)

Gender

- Male: the average decreased from 6.83 credits to 6.39 credits (-0.44 credits; -6 percent)
- o Female: the average decreased from 6.47 credits to 6.18 credits (-0.29 credits; -5 percent)

Student Type

- o First-time in college: the average decreased from 8.20 credits to 7.62 credits (-0.58 credits; -7 percent)
- Returning/Re-applying: the average decreased from 6.40 credits to 6.04 credits (-0.36 credits; -6 percent)

Race/Ethnicity

- White: the average decreased from 5.91 credits to 5.63 credits (-0.28 credits; -5 percent)
- o Black/African American: the average decreased from 7.22 credits to 6.83 credits (-0.39 credits; -5 percent)
- o Hispanic/Latino: the average decreased from 7.04 credits to 6.65 credits (-0.39 credits; -6 percent)
- o Asian: the average decreased from 6.96 credits to 6.35 credits (-0.61 credits; -9 percent)

- Alexandria City: the average decreased from 7.77 credits to 7.26 credits (-0.51 credits; -7 percent)
- Fairfax County: the average decreased from 6.14 credits to 5.70 credits (-0.44 credits; -7 percent)

Headcount and Average Credits by Student Demographics at the Annandale Campus: Fall 2012 through Fall 2014

Headcount

The headcount at Annandale Campus decreased by 2 percent (-448 students) from 21,790 students in Fall 2012 to 21,342 students in Fall 2014. Disaggregating the data by demographic categories reveals the following considerable changes in headcount between Fall 2012 and Fall 2014.

• Age Group

22-24: decreased from 4,246 students to 3,993 students (-253 students; -6 percent)

Gender

o Male: decreased from 10,907 students to 10,494 students (-413 students; -4 percent)

Race/Ethnicity

- White: decreased from 8,704 students to 8,140 students (-564 students; -7 percent)
- o Asian: decreased from 4,546 students to 4,274 students (-272 students; -6 percent)

Jurisdiction

o Fairfax County: decreased from 11,889 students to 11,080 students (-809 students; -7 percent)

Overall, the average number of credits enrolled in per semester by students at Annandale Campus decreased by 3 percent from 7.52 credits in Fall 2012 to 7.32 credits in Fall 2014. Disaggregating the data by demographic categories reveals the following substantive changes in average credit enrollment between Fall 2012 and Fall 2014.

Age Group

- o 18-21: the average decreased from 9.29 credits to 9.00 credits (-0.29 credits; -3 percent)
- o 22-24: the average decreased from 7.07 credits to 6.77 credits (-0.30 credits; -4 percent)

Student Type

Returning/Reapplying: the average decreased from 7.22 credits to 6.95 credits (-0.27 credits; -4 percent)

Race/Ethnicity

- Black/African American: the average decreased from 6.73 credits to 6.39 credits (-0.34 credits; -5 percent)
- o Asian: the average decreased from 8.88 credits to 8.56 credits (-0.32 credits; -4 percent)
- Two or more races: the average decreased from 8.01 credits to 7.27 credits (-0.74 credits; -9 percent)

Headcount and Average Credits by Student Demographics at the Loudoun Campus: Fall 2012 through Fall 2014

Headcount

The headcount at Loudoun Campus increased by 15 percent (+1,459 students) from 9,787 students in Fall 2012 to 11,246 students in Fall 2014. Disaggregating the data by demographic categories reveals the following most extensive changes in headcount between Fall 2012 and Fall 2014.

Age Group

- Under 18: increased from 208 students to 922 students (+714 students; +343 percent)
- o 18-21: increased from 4,210 students to 4,988 students (+778 students; +19 percent)

Gender

- Male: increased from 4,532 students to 5,414 students (+882 students; +20 percent)
- o Female: increased from 5,255 students to 5,832 students (+577 students; +11 percent)

Student Type

First-time in college: increased from 1,576 students to 2,812 students (+1,236 students; +78 percent)

Race/Ethnicity

- White: increased from 5,082 students to 5,519 students (+437, +9 percent)
- o Black/African American: increased from 1,158 students to 1,413 students (+255; +22 percent)
- Hispanic/Latino: increased from 1,459 students to 1,969 students (+510; +35 percent)
- o Asian: increased from 1,363 students to 1,577 students (+214; +16 percent)

Jurisdiction

Loudoun County: increased from 4,285 students to 5,486 students (+1,201 students; +28 percent)

The average number of credits enrolled in per semester by Loudoun Campus students decreased by 5 percent from 7.10 credits in Fall 2012 to 6.74 in Fall 2014. Disaggregating the data by demographic categories reveals the following considerable changes in average credits between Fall 2012 and Fall 2014.

Age Group

- o 18-21: the average decreased from 9.22 credits to 8.74 credits (-0.48 credits; -5 percent)
- o 22-24: the average decreased from 6.33 credits to 5.92 credits (-0.41 credits; -7 percent)

Gender

- I. STUDENT SUCCESS Northern Virginia Community College will move into the top tier of community colleges with respect to the college readiness, developmental course completion, retention, graduation, transfer, and career placement of its students.
- II. ACCESS Northern Virginia Community College will increase the number and diversity of students being served to mirror the population growth of the region.
- III. TEACHING AND LEARNING Northern Virginia Community College will focus on student success by creating an environment of world-class teaching and learning.
- IV. EXCELLENCE Northern Virginia Community College will develop ten focal points of excellence in its educational programs and services that will be benchmarked to the best in the nation and strategic to building the College's overall reputation for quality.
- V. LEADERSHIP Northern Virginia Community College will serve as a catalyst and a leader in developing educational and economic opportunities for all Northern Virginians and in maintaining the quality of life and economic competitiveness of the region.
- VI. PARTNERSHIPS Northern Virginia Community College will develop strategic partnerships to create gateways of opportunity and an integrated educational system for Northern Virginians who are pursuing the American Dream.
- VII. RESOURCES Northern Virginia Community College will increase its annual funding by \$100 million and expand its physical facilities by more than one million square feet in new and renovated space. This includes the establishment of two additional campuses at epicenters of the region's population growth, as well as additional education and training facilities in or near established population centers.
- VIII. EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND CONTINUITY OF OPERATIONS Northern Virginia Community College will be recognized as a leader among institutions of higher education in Virginia for its development and testing of emergency response and continuity of operation plans.
