## Average Cost of Attendance for In-State NOVA Students: 2007-08 through 2013-14

This Research Brief presents data on the average cost of attendance (COA) for NOVA students from 2007-08 through 2013-14. ${ }^{1}$ Data are presented for full-time, degree-seeking students who applied for need-based aid and resided in-state. Data are disaggregated by housing status: students living independently compared to students living with their parents. For comparison purposes, the average cost of attendance for students in the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) during the same time period is also examined.

The data show that the average cost of attendance at NOVA was higher than the VCCS average. The data also show that for both NOVA students and students across the VCCS, those living independently had a higher cost of attendance than those who lived with their parents.

As seen in Table 1 and Figure 1 (next page), the average cost of attendance for independent students at NOVA rose from $\$ 13,390$ in 2007-08 to $\$ 19,235$ in 2013-14; an increase of $\$ 5,845$, or 44 percent. The average cost of attendance for NOVA students living with their parents increased by 47 percent, or $\$ 5,441$ over the same time period, from $\$ 11,641$ in 2007-08 to $\$ 17,082$ in 2013-14. On average, independent students paid more than students living with their parents. The difference in average cost of attendance between these student groups was at its highest point in 2010-11 (\$2,738).

Table 2 and Figure 2 (next page) present the average cost of attendance between 2007-08 and 2013-14 for students attending colleges within the VCCS. The average cost of attendance for students across the VCCS was lower than the average cost of attendance for NOVA students in all years, for both students living independently and students living with their parents.

In 2007-08, the average cost of attendance for independent VCCS students as a whole was $\$ 1,015$ less than for independent NOVA students. This difference quadrupled to $\$ 4,123$ in 201011 but declined thereafter. In 2013-14, the average cost of attendance for independent VCCS students was $\$ 2,820$ less than for independent NOVA students.

In 2007-08, the average cost of attendance for VCCS students living with their parents was $\$ 806$ lower than for the equivalent students at NOVA. This difference increased to $\$ 2,937$ in 2010-11 before decreasing to $\$ 2,377$ in 2013-14.
