2013-14 Northern Virginia Public High School Graduates Enrolled at NOVA in Fall 2014

Introduction

This Report presents data on Northern Virginia public high school graduates who graduated in 2013-14 and enrolled at Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA) in Fall 2014. The NOVA service area encompasses eight school divisions, which include: Alexandria City, Arlington County, Fairfax County, Falls Church City, Loudoun County, Manassas City, Manassas Park City, and Prince William County.

Section 1 presents the number of 2013-14 graduates from each public high school by school division. Section 2 shows the number of 2013-14 high school graduates enrolled at NOVA in Fall 2014 by school division. Section 3 shows the number of 2013-14 high school graduates enrolled at NOVA in Fall 2014 by closest NOVA campus. Each high school is affiliated with a particular NOVA campus by proximity, although students are able to designate any NOVA campus as their home campus. The data are presented by closest NOVA campus and affiliated public high schools and provide the number of graduates from each school by their actual home campus.

High school graduate data were obtained from the Virginia Department of Education (DOE) website¹. Enrollment data for the 2013-14 Northern Virginia public high school graduates enrolled at NOVA during Fall 2014 were obtained from NOVA's PeopleSoft records².

Section 1. 2013-14 Northern Virginia Public High School Graduates by School Division

In Section 1, Tables 1 through 8 present 2013-14 high school graduates from schools in eight public school divisions: Alexandria City, Arlington County, Falls Church City, Fairfax County, Loudoun County, Manassas City, Manassas Park City, and Prince William County. The Northern Virginia school divisions with the greatest numbers of graduates in 2013-14 were Fairfax County (12,992), Prince William County (5,682), and Loudoun County (4,515). Among all high schools in these eight divisions, Westfield in Fairfax County had the greatest number of graduates (699), followed by Osbourn Park in Prince William County (690), and T.C. Williams in Alexandria City (685).

Section 2. 2013-14 Northern Virginia Public High School Graduates Enrolled at NOVA by High School Division: Fall 2014

Table 9 presents 2013-14 Northern Virginia public high school graduates enrolled at NOVA during Fall 2014 by high school division. Data are organized by school division with affiliated high schools presented alphabetically.

Overall, 23% of Northern Virginia high school graduates in 2013-14 enrolled at NOVA in Fall 2014. The greatest proportion of 2013-14 public high school graduates who enrolled at NOVA during Fall 2014 were from the Prince William County school division (27%), followed by Manassas Park City (26%), Manassas City (25%), Loudoun County (22%), Alexandria City and Fairfax County (each 21%), Arlington County (19%), and Falls Church City (9%).

Section 3. 2013-14 Northern Virginia Public High School Graduates Enrolled at NOVA by Campus: Fall 2014

Table 10 presents 2013-14 Northern Virginia public high school graduates enrolled at NOVA during Fall 2014 by campus. Data are organized by NOVA campus with affiliated high schools presented alphabetically. Although high schools are affiliated with NOVA campuses particularly by proximity, students may select any NOVA campus as their “home” campus. The number of graduates enrolled at NOVA are therefore reported by NOVA “home” campus (AL, AN, LO, MA, ME, WO). The Medical Education Campus is not affiliated with particular high schools due to the specialized nature of its programs.

As seen in Table 10, 25% of 2013-14 public high school graduates in the Woodbridge Campus service area enrolled at NOVA in Fall 2014., 2013-14 high school graduates in the Alexandria and Manassas Campus service areas enrolled at NOVA at a rate of 23% each, 22% of recent high school graduates in the Loudoun Campus service area enrolled at NOVA, and 20% of recent high school graduates in the Annandale Campus service area enrolled at NOVA. Overall, 22% of 2013-14 Northern Virginia high school graduates enrolled at NOVA in Fall 2014. The three high schools with the greatest percentage of graduates who enrolled at NOVA were Annandale (39%), Park View (37%), and Falls Church (36%).
