

The First Year Experience (FYE) at NOVA provides first-year students with academic, career, and social support during their first year of college. One component of the FYE initiative is completion of an FYE section of SDV 100: College Success Skills. These FYE SDV 100 sections include only first-year students and emphasize peer mentoring, career and major exploration, study skills, and other first-year student issues.

This Research Brief presents the average cumulative grade point average (GPA) of first-time to NOVA students who enrolled in FYE SDV 100 during Fall 2013 and the Fall-to-Spring retention rates of these students. These student success outcomes were compared to those of all other first-time students enrolled in Fall 2013. Additionally, data are disaggregated by gender and race/ethnicity. Due to the difference in the number of first-time students who enrolled in FYE SDV 100 and the number of those who were not enrolled, comparisons should be made with caution.

Overall findings indicate that students who enrolled in FYE SDV 100 in Fall 2013 earned a higher average cumulative GPA and were retained at higher rates compared to all other first-time students.

Table 1 shows the average cumulative GPA for students enrolled in FYE SDV 100 in Fall 2013 and for all other first-time students. The average cumulative GPA of students enrolled in FYE SDV 100 was higher (2.34) than that of the comparison group (2.04).

Table 2 presents the average cumulative GPA of students by FYE SDV 100 enrollment status and gender. In Fall 2013, the average cumulative GPA for female students enrolled in FYE SDV 100 was higher (2.96) than that of their counterparts (2.16). This was true for males as well, however the GPA of males enrolled in FYE SDV 100 (1.93) and that of those not enrolled (1.92) was nearly the same.

Table 3 displays the average cumulative GPA of students enrolled in FYE SDV 100 and all other firsttime students by race/ethnicity. Among White, Asian, and Hispanic students, those who enrolled in FYE SDV 100 averaged higher cumulative GPAs than their counterparts.

Table 4 presents the Fall-to-Spring retention rates of students enrolled in FYE SDV 100 and all other first-time students. Students who enrolled in FYE SDV 100 during Fall 2013 returned to NOVA at a higher rate the following semester (87%) compared to all other first-time students (71%).

Table 5 shows the Fall-to-Spring retention rates by gender for students enrolled in FYE SDV 100 and all other first-time students. Both males and females who enrolled in FYE SDV 100 returned to the College at higher rates than the comparison groups (males: 84% vs. 71%; females: 91% vs. 72%).

Table 6 displays the Fall-to-Spring retention rates by race/ethnicity for students enrolled in FYE SDV 100 and all other first-time students. Retention rates were higher for White, Asian, and Hispanic students who enrolled in FYE SDV 100 compared to all other first-time students among those groups.
