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### High School Profile - Fairfax County Public Schools: 2015-16

This Report is part of a series of high school profile reports that present key demographic and college readiness statistics for each of the high schools in NOVA's service area. NOVA's service area includes the following jurisdictions: Alexandria City, Arlington County, Fairfax County, Falls Church City, Loudoun County, Manassas City, Manassas Park City, and Prince William County. This Report pertains to the Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) division. The definitions below provide an overview of the statistics that are presented in this Report.

**Number of Graduates and Completers:** Public high school and graduate completer data are collected on an annual basis during the fall. Graduates include those who received a diploma (standard, advanced studies, special, modified standard, or general achievement). Completers may receive a certificate, such as the General Educational Development (GED) Certificate. The following definitions were retrieved from the Virginia Department of Education (VA DOE) <a href="http://schoolquality.virginia.gov">http://schoolquality.virginia.gov</a>.

**Enrollment and Demographics:** Includes the number of students enrolled at each high school and key demographic information such as gender and race composition of the student body.

**SAT Scores:** Presents average SAT scores in each SAT section (critical reading, math, and writing) at the high school (College Board), public school division (College Board), and state levels (VA DOE).

**Standards of Learning (SOL):** The SOLs describe the Commonwealth's expectations for student learning. Virginia high school students are assessed in reading, writing, math, science, and history. The proportion of students who successfully passed standards of learning assessments are presented at the high school, public school division, and state levels.

**Absenteeism:** A student is considered chronically absent if he or she misses two or more instructional days per month (18 days, or 10 percent of a 180-day school year) regardless of whether the absences are excused or unexcused. According to the U.S. DOE, a student who is chronically absent in any year between eight and twelfth grade is seven times more likely to drop out of school. This report presents the proportion of students who were chronically late. Data is presented at the high school, public school division, and state levels.

Free and Reduced Meal Eligibility: Students from families with incomes at or below 130 percent of the poverty level are eligible for free meals. Those between 130 percent and 180 percent of poverty level are eligible for reduced-price meals, for which students can be charged no more than 40 cents for lunch and 30 cents for breakfast. The proportion of free and reduced meal-eligible students is presented at the high school, public school division, and state levels.

Advanced Placement Course Enrollment and Test Taking: Advanced Placement (AP) courses are created by the College Board and offer college-level curricula and examinations to high school students. American colleges and universities may grant placement and course credit to students who obtain high scores on the examinations. The more challenging a student's high school curriculum, the more likely they are to persist at a post-secondary institution.<sup>1</sup> AP course enrollment is presented at the high school, public school division, and state levels.

**Dual Enrollment:** Dual Enrollment is an enrichment opportunity that allows high school students to earn college credits while still being enrolled in high school. Studies show that students who acquire college credits while in high school are more likely to graduate and continue their education beyond high school. The rate of dual enrollment is presented at the high school, public school division, and state levels.

**On-time Graduation Rate within Four Years:** On-time graduates are students who earn high school diplomas within four years of entering the ninth grade. The on-time graduation rate is presented at the high school, public school division, and state levels.

**Postsecondary Enrollment:** Postsecondary enrollment shows the number and percent of Virginia high school graduates who enrolled in an institution of higher education within sixteen months of graduating from high school in 2013-14. The postsecondary enrollment rate is presented at the high school, public school division, and state levels.

### **Inter-Division Snapshot**

### **Graduates and Completers**

In 2015-16, there were 27,243 graduates and completers in NOVA's service area. Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) generated 49 percent of these graduates.

### **Mean SAT Scores**

FCPS average SAT scores across all sections were about the second highest among all divisions in NOVA's service area and were higher than the state averages (the state averages were as follows: Critical Reading – 516, Math – 513, Writing – 493).




Figure 2. Mean SAT Scores by Division: 2016

### **Dual Enrollment**

In Virginia, 9 percent of students were dual enrolled in 2015-16. However, the FCPS division had a relatively low proportion of students dual enrolled in 2015-16 (2 percent).




Figure 3. Proportion of Dual Enrollment Students by Division: 2015-16

### **Postsecondary Enrollment**

Postsecondary enrollment pertains to the proportion of high school graduates who enrolled at a two- or four-year institution within sixteen months of graduating. Statewide, 72 percent of the 2013-14 graduate cohort enrolled at a postsecondary institution by 2016. In the FCPS division, the postsecondary enrollment rate was 84 percent.




Figure 4. Rate of Postsecondary Enrollment by Division: 2013-14 Graduate Cohort

### Fairfax County Public Schools


Overall the number of graduates and completers in the Fairfax County Public School (FCPS) division increased by 3 percent from 2011-12 to 2015-16. However, 11 of the 28 high schools in the division experienced a decrease in the number of graduates and completers.

The FCPS average SAT scores were above the state average SAT scores on each section in 2016 (up to 59 points higher). Across all subjects, the Standards of Learning (SOL) pass rate was higher in the FCPS division than in the state of Virginia as a whole (up to 9 percentage points higher). In the FCPS division, in comparison to the state, students were less likely to be eligible for free and reduced meals (28 percent compared to 42 percent) or to be absent from class (10 percent compared to 11 percent). FCPS students were also more likely to be enrolled in advanced courses (28 percent compared to 21 percent), to graduate on time (92 percent compared to 91 percent), and to enroll at a postsecondary institution (84 percent compared to 72 percent). However, not all schools in the FCPS division performed above the state level. For example, schools such as Bryant Alternative, Fairfax County Adult, and Mountain View Alternative had lower SOL pass rates, higher absenteeism, and lower postsecondary enrollment rates than the state of Virginia overall.

Figure 6. Annandale High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16




Figure 7. Annandale High School Students' Mean SAT Scores: 2016





Figure 8. Bryant Alternative High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16











Figure 10. Centreville High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16









Figure 12. Chantilly High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16

















Figure 18. Fairfax County Adult High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16









Figure 20. Falls Church High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16









Figure 22. George Marshall High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16













Figure 26. Herndon High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16







Figure 28. James Madison High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16




Figure 29. James Madison High School Students' Mean SAT Scores: 2016





Figure 30. Lake Braddock Secondary School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16











Figure 34. McLean High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16




Figure 35. McLean High School Students' Mean SAT Scores: 2016





Figure 36. Mount Vernon High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16







Figure 38. Mountain View Alternative High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16




Figure 39. Mountain View Alternative High School Students' Mean SAT Scores: 2016





Figure 41. Oakton High School Students' Mean SAT Scores: 2016





Figure 42. Robert E. Lee High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16







Figure 44. Robinson Secondary School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16




Figure 45. Robinson Secondary School Students' Mean SAT Scores: 2016







Figure 48. South Lakes High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16









Figure 50. Stuart High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16











Figure 52. Thomas Jefferson High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16











Figure 54. W.T. Woodson High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16











Figure 56. West Potomac High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16













Figure 58. West Springfield High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16











Figure 60. Westfield High School Student Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity: 2015-16








