Awards Conferred at NOVA by Race/Ethnicity: 2008-09 through 2012-13

This Research Brief presents data from the State Council on Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV) on awards conferred at NOVA by race/ethnicity from 2008-09 through 2012-13. The data encompass three types of awards: career studies certificates (between 9 and 29 credits), certificates (30 to 59 credits), and associate degrees (60 or more credits)¹. Data are presented by race/ethnicity for each of the three award types.

Table 1 and Figure 2 (next page) present the number of total award completions at NOVA by race/ethnicity for all students from 2008-09 through 2012-13. The totals encompass career studies certificate programs, certificate programs, and associate degree programs. In each of the five years, the largest percentage of awards were conferred to White students, with the percentage decreasing overall from 48% in 2008-09 to 42% in 2012-13. The changes during the five years for the other races/ethnicities were smaller. The percentage of awards earned by Black students ranged from 11% to 14% of total degree completions, with an overall increase from 13% in 2008-09 to 14% in 2012-13. The percentage of award recipients who were Asian decreased overall from 19% to 17% during the five-year span. In contrast, the proportion awards earned by Hispanic students increased overall from 13% to 16%.

¹ SCHEV classifies degrees by the amount of time it would take for a full-time student to complete; each grouping corresponds with a NOVA degree. The three groups defined by SCHEV include certificates for "less than 1 academic year, requiring completion of an organized program of study within two semesters" (career studies certificates) and certificates for "at least 1 but less than 2 academic years, which is designed for completion in at least 30, but less than 60 credit hours" (certificates). SCHEV describes an associate degree as "normally requir[ing] two years of full-time college work." Figure 1. Number of Total Awards at NOVA by Race/Ethnicity: 2008-09 through 2012-13




Table 2 and Figure 2 (next page) show the number of and percentages for completions of career studies certificates awarded at NOVA by race/ethnicity from 2008-09 through 2012-13. During the five years, the proportion of awards fluctuated for the four largest groups. The largest overall increase was seen for career studies certificates awarded to Hispanic students, which grew from 10% in 2008-09 to 15% in 2012-13. Both Black and Asian award recipients saw a decrease of 3 percentage points (from 19% to 16% of awards conferred to Black students and 14% to 11% of awards conferred to Asian students). While the percentage of career studies certificates received by White students fluctuated during this time period, this group began and ended the five-year span at 49%.

Figure 2. Number of Career Studies Certificates Completed at NOVA by Race/Ethnicity: 2008-09 through 2012-13




Table 3 and Figure 3 display the number of certificates awarded at NOVA; data are by race/ethnicity and from 2008-09 through 2012-13. The largest change was a decrease in the percentage of certificate recipients who were White; this decreased from 48% in 2008-09 to 38% in 2012-13. The proportions fluctuated for the three other largest groups during this time period. The proportion of certificates awarded to Asian students increased overall by 6 percentage points during this time period from 12% to 18%, while this decreased overall by 4 percentage points for certificates awarded to Black students (from 19% to 15%). While the percentage of certificates received by Hispanic students initially decreased from 17% in 2008-09 to 12% in 2009-10, it has steadily increased since then to 19% in 2012-13.

Figure 3. Number of Certificates Completed at NOVA by Race/Ethnicity: 2008-09 through 2012-13




Table 4 and Figure 4 (next page) present the number of and percentages for associate degrees completed at NOVA by race/ethnicity from 2008-09 through 2012-13. As with the certificate awards, associate degrees saw the largest change with White students, with an overall decrease from 48% in 2008-09 to 42% in 2012-13. The proportion of associate degrees received by Hispanic students increased overall by 2 percentage points (from 13% to 15%), while the percentage of associate degrees earned by Asian students decreased by 1 percentage point during this time period (from 19% to 18%). The proportion of associate degrees conferred to Black students was the same for both 2008-09 and 2012-13 at 13%.
