
Notes (continued on back):

1. Choose one course from ODU's VCCS Transfer Guide <http://www.odu.edu/transfer/vccs-transfer-guide.html> in any of the following categories: Philosophy and Ethics, Human Creativity, Literature or Foreign Language; also ensuring it fulfills the Humanities elective required for the AAS.
2. If you complete MTH 155 or 245 with a grade of C or higher instead of MTH 154 at NVCC, student will not have to take STAT 130M at ODU.
3. CRJS 262 plus CRJS 2ELE (6 credits) will be awarded for Police Academy training if applicable.
4. These courses can be taken at ODU or VCCS. If taken at VCCS, student must choose courses from ODU's VCCS Transfer Guide <http://www.odu.edu/transfer/vccs-transfer-guide.html> 3 credits in any of the following categories: Philosophy and Ethics, Human Creativity, Literature, Interpreting the Past or Foreign Language; 8 credits in the category of Nature of Science; and 3 credits in Human Behavior (Do not take a course equivalent to PSYC 201S, SOC 201S or CRJS 215S because these are already fulfilled within the AAS requirements). Remaining lower-division general education requirements are met by completion of all courses outlined in this transfer agreement guide.

Notes (continued):

- *Lower-Division General Education waiver and course substitutions are not automatic upon enrollment to ODU, students must notify academic advisor for these to be processed upon verification.*
- *Course requirements listed in this agreement are based on the 2022-2023 catalogs for each institution but are valid until 2024, unless an updated agreement guide was created and is available on the ODU Transfer Pathways website: <https://odu.edu/transfer/transfer-pathways/vccs>*
- *Grade of C or higher is required to receive course credit.*
