Cybersecurity and Criminology Bootcamp

OVERVIEW

The Cybersecurity, and Criminology Bootcamp is a hybrid program that will take place over 7 weeks. Taught at a UK Centre of Excellence in Cyber Security and the School of Business, Law, and Social Sciences at Abertay University, Scotland. The first four weeks will take place virtually and the second three weeks will take place in Dundee, Scotland. The cybersecurity portion of the program will include both cybersecurity as well as an introduction to C++ programming. The aim of this course is to provide the student with knowledge of the issues and practicalities involved in securing computer systems and the framework within which computer security specialists would need to operate. The Criminology course will provide students with an introduction to the criminal justice system and processes in Scotland and the UK with an international vantage point. It will examine how the criminal justice system operates, its key agencies and processes, as well as their relationship with the wider institutions, structures and issues in modern society allowing comparison with the US. It will also consider the ongoing debates concerning the role of the victim in the criminal justice system and the wider debates and theories on crime and justice and how these have influenced the development of the criminal justice system in the UK. How these debates and theories compare to similar issues in the US will also be discussed. The program will also allow weekly excursions to cultural sites around Scotland.
