Introduction

This Report presents student enrollment and success data for the Interior Design program. Interior Design courses are offered only at the Loudoun Campus. Section 1 provides unduplicated enrollment data on students in the Interior Design program from Fall 2013 through Spring 2018. Data are disaggregated by gender, race, age, enrollment status, campus, modality, day/night status, and session.

Section 2.A presents student Grade Distribution by Course for the Interior Design program from Fall 2015 through Spring 2018 and Student Success by Session for the Interior Design program for Spring 2017 and Fall 2017. Section 2.B presents student graduation rate for the Interior Design program from the Fall 2010 Cohort through the Fall 2014 Cohort. Section 2.C presents the mean GPA of graduates for the Interior Design program from 2013-14 through 2017-18.
