### **Introduction**

This Report presents student enrollment and success data for the Political Science program. Political Science courses are offered at Alexandria, Annandale, Manassas, and Woodbridge campuses and Online. Section 1 provides unduplicated enrollment data on students in the Political Science program for 2013-2014 through 2017-2018. Data are disaggregated by gender, race, age, enrollment status, campus, modality, day/night status, and session.
