NOVA COLLEGE-WIDE COURSE CONTENT SUMMARY ADJ 100 - SURVEY OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE (3 CR.)

Course Description

Presents an overview of the United States criminal justice system; introduces the major system components: law enforcement, judiciary and corrections. Lecture 3 hours per week.

Provides insights into career opportunities available in the field of criminal justice. Reviews current trends and critical topics in criminal justice.

- Discuss the interdependency between law enforcement agencies, courts, and corrections.
- Explain the basic process of entering the criminal justice system.
- Define crimes and causation of crimes.
- Discuss career opportunities in the criminal justice system.
