Course Description

Enables students to improve pronunciation, articulation and vocal quality. Includes applied phonetics. Lecture 3 hours per week.

Helps the student to assess personal voice and diction patterns and provides structured class experiences to facilitate speech improvement. Emphasis is on non-clinical speech concerns.

Course Prerequisites/Co-requisites

Fluency in Standard American English. Recommend proficiency in reading and writing at English 111 level.
