NOVA COLLEGE-WIDE COURSE CONTENT SUMMARY CST 137 - ORAL INTERPRETATION (3 CR.)

Course Description

Studies the theory and practice of performing various types of literature: prose, poetry, and drama. Emphasizes the relationship among the oral interpreter, the literary work, and the audience. Lecture 3 hours per week.

General Course Purpose

Provides the student with the opportunity to develop competencies in both the understanding and performance of oral communication of literature.

Course Prerequisites/Co-requisites

Fluency in Standard American English. Recommend proficiency in reading and writing at English111 level.

Course Objectives
