NOVA COLLEGE-WIDE COURSE CONTENT SUMMARY IDS 100 – THEORY AND TECHNIQUES OF INTERIOR DESIGN (3 CR.)

Course Description

Introduces drafting and presentation, color theory, and coordination, space planning and arrangement of furnishings. Lecture 2 hours. Laboratory 3 hours. Total 5 hours per week

General Course Purpose

The course is designed to introduce the student to the profession of interior design, including the different aspects of both residential and commercial projects. Students will gain knowledge of general design principles, color theory, materials selections, business principles and practices and space planning as they relate to residential and commercial design.
