# NOVA COLLEGE-WIDE COURSE CONTENT SUMMARY PHT 232 - PHOTOJOURNALISM II (3 CR.)

## **Course Description**

Introduces equipment, techniques, skills, and concepts of photojournalism. Teaches photography for features, spot news, and photo essays. Emphasizes editing, captioning, and layout. May require individual projects. Lecture 2 hours. Laboratory 3 hours. Total 5 hours per week.

## **General Course Purpose**

To give students the opportunity to apply skills learned in 231 in advanced photojournalism projects, to learn additional shooting skills, and to engage in class critiques

### Course Prerequisites/Corequisites

Prerequisites: PHT 102, PHT 231 or equivalent

#### **Course Objectives**

Upon completing the course, the student will be able to:

- > Shoot documentary and narrative photographs
- Solve lighting problems and use flash
- Plan and shoot a compelling and ethical photo essay
- Edit, caption, and present photographs in a professional manner
- Make layout decisions for multi-picture stories with text
- Discuss photojournalism issues and images

- Tools, including cameras, flash, and computers
- Exposure
- Shooting, editing, and captioning single and multi picture stories.
- Producing a long term photojournalism project
- Editing and layout considerations for print and electronic media
- Historical and contemporary photojournalism
- Ethics and professional practice
