SOC 245 - SOCIOLOGY OF AGING (3 CR.)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Introduces the study of aging with special emphasis on later stages of the life cycle. Includes theories of aging, historical and comparative settings, social policy, and future trends of aging. Lecture 3 hours per week.

To increase understanding of the aging process, of the needs and contributions of the elderly, of social factors shaping the life cycle, and of future policy issues.
