NVCC COLLEGE-WIDE COURSE CONTENT SUMMARY SPA 150 – SPANISH FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT (3 CR.)

Course Description

Introduces Spanish to those in the criminal justice field. Emphasizes oral communication and practical first-hand police and criminal justice vocabulary. Includes oral drill and practice. Lecture 3 hours per week.

General Course Purpose

To provide law enforcement officials with the basic language skills necessary to communicate with the Spanish-speaking community. Students learn to communicate in Spanish within a limited context of vocabulary and grammatical structures.

Course Prerequisites/Co-requisites

No prior knowledge of Spanish is required.

Course Objectives

By the end of the course, students will be able to:

- Understand simple spoken Spanish within the limited context presented to beginners.
- Speak simple Spanish with correct pronunciation at normal conversational speed.
- Read the Spanish the student has already learned to comprehend and speak.
- Write accurately what the student has learned to understand, say and read.

Major Topics to be Covered

The student will learn the appropriate structures of the Spanish language in a prescribed sequence beginning with the simplest and working toward the more complex. Students learn correct Spanish pronunciation.
